Over the past fifteen years, medWish International has evolved from a grassroots organization into a significant provider of medical humanitarian aid to recipients worldwide. From our humble beginnings to our current location, a 36,000 square foot donated warehouse, medWish International continues to expand operations in the most cost-effective and efficient ways.

Since 2005, the medWish International Recover, Recycle, Redistribute program has grown exponentially – experiencing a **1,000%** increase in the number of medical items recovered from hospitals, healthcare facilities, medical supply companies, and individuals. In measuring our impact, medWish International saw a **3,000%** increase in the amount of medical aid redistributed to countries worldwide. The relief provided by medWish International empowers doctors, nurses and clinic workers with the necessary lifesaving resources to improve healthcare in their regions. Never before in the history of our organization has medWish International had the ability to vastly advance the health and wellness of thousands of individuals on a global level.

The environmental impact of the Recovery component of our program averages to nearly 1,200 pounds of medical supplies diverted daily from landfills.

Our success is a direct result of the passion and commitment of our staff, board, volunteers and donors. Through the tons of medical items donated by our healthcare facilities and corporations, the thousands of volunteer hours dedicated to sorting supplies, and the financial donors that sustain our entire operation- each individual plays a critical role in medWish International's ability to save lives globally and improve our environment.

*medWish International is the Cleveland-based nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery, recycling and redistribution of donated medical supplies, equipment and furnishings to developing countries worldwide in an effort to save lives and save the environment.*

### STATISTICS

- Recovered more than 450,000 pounds of usable, lifesaving medical supplies, equipment and furnishings
- Redistributed more than 315,000 pounds providing assistance for 202 humanitarian aid projects in 50 countries and supporting 122 recipient organizations
- In the past three years, medWish International has witnessed a tremendous operational growth:
  - Since 2006, the amount of supplies received per month has increased by a factor of 10
  - From 2006 through 2008, the amount of supplies distributed per month has increased by a factor of 6

### SAVING LIVES

For 15 years, medWish International has provided lifesaving medical supplies to suffering men, women and children in forgotten corners of the world. These oftentimes basic medical supplies – items like gauze, bandages, suture and gloves – may mean the difference between life and death for a pregnant woman...a newborn baby...or an injured farmer. Through partnerships with dozens of local and national hospitals, healthcare facilities and medical supply companies, medWish International is able to divert medical supplies, equipment and furnishings otherwise earmarked for the landfill and redistribute them to needy people worldwide. Throughout its brief existence, medWish International has positively affected the quality and quantity of medical care available to the poor around the world by providing both simple and sophisticated medical items that are often taken for granted in industrialized nations.

### SAVING THE ENVIRONMENT

According to the American Medical Association, United States hospitals discard more than \$6.25 billion of unused medical supplies and equipment due to technological changes, regulatory requirements and product overruns or overstocks. Rather than reaching people in need, these items end up clogging landfills and creating an environmental hazard. medWish International's *Recover, Recycle, Redistribute* program transforms these disposable supplies into renewable, lifesaving gifts while simultaneously contributing to the reduction of landfill waste and greenhouse gases. In addition, medWish International actively pursues ways to reduce its own waste. From using compostable products and FSC®-certified paper to recycling metal, plastic, glass and paper, medWish International is committed to employing sustainable practices.

# DONOR SPOTLIGHT

## THE FEDERATED CHURCH (FINANCIAL)

medWish International relies on the kindness and generosity of financial donors to fulfill its mission. While many organizations, foundations and individuals support the operations of medWish International, The Federated Church in Chagrin Falls has been a staunch provider and advocate. In December 2007, The Federated Church donated the entire collection taken at its Christmas Eve services - nearly \$50,000 – to medWish International. The Federated Church continued its support by providing funds for medWish International's 2008 Haiti Relief Mission. In the aftermath of Hurricanes Faye, Gustav and Ike and Tropical Storm Hanna, medWish International, together with Partners In Health, sent a 40-foot container of lifesaving medical supplies to restock damaged clinics and hospitals destroyed by the storms.

## AESCULAP INC., USA (PRODUCT)

medWish International would not exist without the benevolence of its partner hospitals, healthcare facilities and medical supply companies who donate essential medical items to be repurposed as humanitarian aid. One of medWish International's most requested items is suture. This small, simple medical supply is virtually nonexistent in developing countries. In 2008, Aesculap Inc., USA, a division of the B. Braun Melsungen AG, agreed to donate overstocked and short-dated bulk suture materials. This donation drastically increased the amount of suture available to be sent as humanitarian aid, potentially saving thousands of lives.
